THE APPLEKNOCKER TOWN

The Village of Cobden was founded in 1857 during the construction of the Illinois Central Railroad. The downtown uniquely circles the railroad tracks. Cobden is known for its great variety of peaches, apples, and vegetables. The area is home to many orchards and farms. The highlight of the season is the Cobden Peach Festival during the first Friday and Saturday in August.

Today Cobden is nestled among the wineries of Southern Illinois and features several great eating establishments, a museum, and some unique shops.

A unique part of Cobden's history is the "Amazing Appleknockers" basketball team which placed second in the 1964 Illinois State Basketball Tournament (before the establishment of divisions). More recently the school's softball team won three state championships and the boy's baseball team also claimed a championship.

What Cobden Has to Offer (Hours are Subject to Change)

Cobden, IL is located in Union County. The village is 16 miles south of Carbondale and 6 miles north of Anna (take Route 51, look for highway sign and go west 3 miles).

Union County Museum, 117 S. Appleknocker, 893-2865. Operated by the Union County Historical and Genealogy Society. The museum has collections of Anna Pottery, Native American artifacts, railroad/farming history, and historical items of local interest. Special exhibits conducted throughout the year.

Next to the museum is the **Resale Shop**. The shop offers collectibles, upscale, new and gently used décor and household items. The Christmas Shop (decorations, gifts and much more) is operated in November and December. All proceeds go to the museum.
